File Vault Maze

Print and digital materials that are considered historically or culturally important are sometimes preserved in a building known as an **archive**. Archives can contain all kinds of things – documents, maps, correspondence, newspapers, magazines, reports, manuscripts, photographs, illustrations, and much more!

The Archives of the Texas General Land Office (GLO) cares for over 36 million historical documents, maps, and other items that relate to the history of Texas land. These collections are looked after by GLO **archivists** and other experts. Documents are typically stored in areas known as file vaults, or stacks.
